Thoughts From the Desk of Shirley...

When I learn something new, I wonder if I'm the only person in the world that doesn't know about what I've learned. Last week, I learned that on every donkey, there is a sign of a cross. This cross-like pattern is created by a darker strip of hair running down the donkey's spine, intersected by another strip of hair across its shoulders. This distinctive marking is often referred to as a "cruciform dorsal stripe".

The marking has sparked curiosity and led to many interpretations throughout history. I personally have not ridden on too many donkeys in my lifetime, so unless somebody pointed this marking out to me, I wouldn't have known about it.

In Christian tradition, donkeys are linked to the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Jesus rode a borrowed donkey into the city. People waved palm branches and covered the ground with their cloaks and other wearing apparel for the donkey to walk on. This gentle animal who had never been ridden before carried Jesus in the parade in Jerusalem. Little did the people know that just a few days later, Jesus would be crucified



The donkey symbolizes peace and Jesus is a man of peace and that day was blessed to be peaceful, for all Christians to celebrate peacefully around the world. Surely this is why we view the donkey as very calm and loving.

The cross-shaped marking on donkeys' backs has been interpreted as a divine sign, a sacred imprint, signifying the donkey's participation in the triumphant walk into Jerusalem.

Some people also linked the concept of bearing the cross, as a visual reminder of the sacrificial journey undertaken by Jesus, carrying the weight of the cross before his crucifixion.

There are so many cultural and folk lore interpretations of why donkeys have a cross on their back. I would like to believe that it was divine intervention at one point in time that put the cross on the donkey and the fulfilled prophecy that put Jesus on the donkey to march into Jerusalem to his crucifixion and the cross and his resurrection. The next time you see a donkey, check out his back and look for the sign of the cross.

Holy Week Service

A Tenebrae service was held on Good Friday as people remembered the crucifixion of the Lord. Roger and Marilyn Hladik, JoLynne Reimert and Shirley Nelson took part in the scripture readings. Roger also sang a very moving song, "Calvary" during the service. The Service of Shadows takes place in a dimly lit church, with nine candles being extinguished following the reading of each scripture starting with the Anointing, and followed by the Passover, the Prayer, the Arrest, the Denial, Jesus before Pilate, the crucifixion, Jesus' death and the Burial Mark. The Christ candle remains lit as the others are extinguished. The service is a reminder of what Jesus Christ experienced on his journey to the Cross.
